

**NOTICE OF

DETERMINATION OF NONSIGNIFICANCE (DNS)**

**Port of Olympia
Swantown Marina DEF Dock Parking Lot Storm Water Overflow Repair**

Description of Proposal: This project entails the repair of an existing storm water overflow that serves the parking lot for Swantown Marina's DE&F Docks. The outfall was damaged during a heavy rain event in 2007 when the primary outfall was plugged due to construction activities elsewhere on the Port. Repair activities involve replacing the washed out gravel and rock with new stream-bed quality gravel and rip-rap. Activities will take place from shore to protect the marine environment. This project will protect the shore and adjacent waters from further soil erosion.

Location of Proposal: Swantown Marina is located on the east side of the Port of Olympia peninsula. The street address is 1022 Marine Drive, NE, Olympia, WA 98501. The actual work site is adjacent to the gangway to the "DEF" docks.


This Determination of Nonsignificance (DNS) is issued under WAC 197-11-340(2); the lead agency will not act on this proposal for 14 days from the date of issuance.
